2. Discuss SMEC Grants
 - a. In 2016 the Student Recruitment Committee (SRC) approved a proposal from the Swine Medicine Education Center (SMEC) for \$40,400 to fund 20 non-Iowa State University students to attend two-week SMEC clinical rotations in swine production medicine. This expense will cover the \$2,020 in total course fees for any SMEC rotation that is charged to non-ISU domestic veterinary students. The total amount will cover the majority of out-of-state students that are scheduled to attend this training. The students that enroll in SMEC externships are swine-focused senior veterinary students that attend schools without a strong swine veterinary curriculum or faculty support. SMEC is helping support the Student Recruitment Committee's mission to serve and develop swine-interested students throughout the United States. We, the SRC, have experienced firsthand and understand the value in training and education that SMEC provides to out-of-state and non-traditional swine medicine veterinary schools and students.
 - b. Background: SRC recommended discontinuing the NPIF sponsored summer internship program and replace it with added funding to SMEC rotations.

3. Follow-up on Swine Medicine Talks:
 - a. In 2016 the Student Recruitment Committee (SRC) approved \$6,040 from a \$9,640 proposal from Dr. Paisley Canning, Kristin Skoland, and Dr. Locke Karriker to fund the Swine Medicine Talks. The \$6040 will be used to offset speaker stipends and part-time student salary to develop a 3 part lecture series.

SMEC is helping support the Student Recruitment Committee's mission for swine-interested veterinary student outreach, especially at Veterinary Colleges that do not have a strong veterinary curriculum. SMEC is also committed to promoting AASV student membership and retention.
